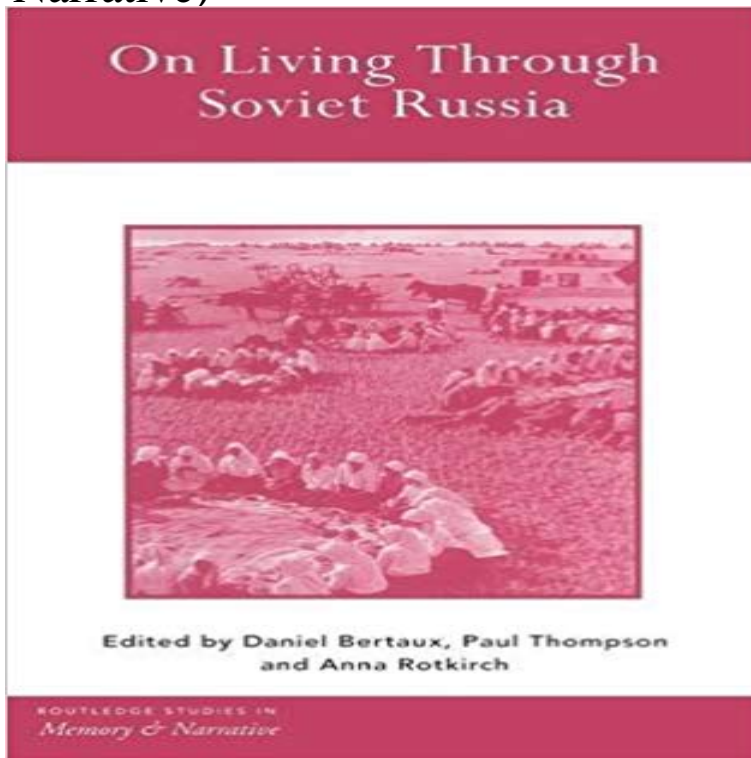


# On Living Through Soviet Russia (Routledge Studies in Memory and Narrative)
