
## I Wish I Could Say I Was Sorry...



With her usual humor and honesty, Susie recalls her early career as a fledgling thief. A 1950s childhood in post-war Londons every shade of grey contrasts vividly with the splendours of Africa as, with her glamorous mother and father, Susie boards a ship bound for exotic, technicolor Kenya. Kenya was in its final decade as a colony, peopled with larger-than-life characters who had helped to forge its identity. There, in this Out Of Africa Karen Blixen setting, with the threats of the Mau Mau uprising ever-present, Susies life disintegrates at break-neck speed into a web of jealousy, rejection and casual cruelty. Each time it seems things cannot get any worse, they do as Susie lifts the lid on her own, often shocking, behavior in her quest to protect herself and those she loves. Rebellious, lonely and self-destructive, it is a small grey pony named Cinderella who saves Susie from herself and brings her the love she craves. Readers will shed a tear at her losses and laugh at her predicaments. This book gives a moving and often shocking insight in the the earlier life of the bestselling French travel writer. What a story! Written in Susies extremely honest way, but unlike her other books, in this one, we learn of her childhood in England and Kenya, her life choices and the decisions she has had to make. Susie is not afraid to put into words her feelings of insecurity as a young girl, evoking compassion for the trials she endured. Im sure autobiographies can be a form of therapy but this one must have been the most painful book to write. I read it in one session. There is humour and there is humanity. At one point I was almost ready to shout at the book: No, no dont do it! The whole story is a great tug on the heart strings. I couldnt put the book down and have every intention of reading it again.
