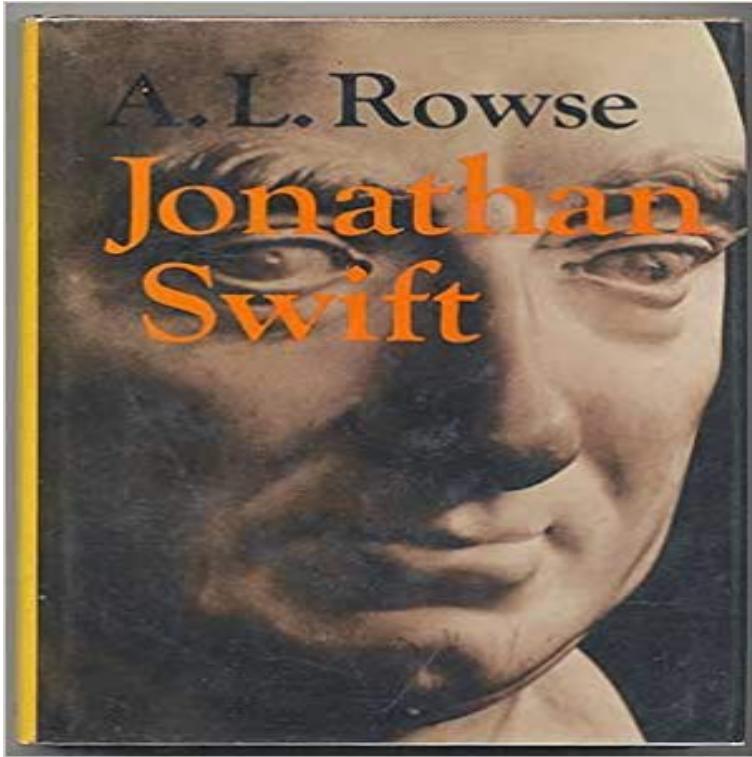


Jonathan Swift
