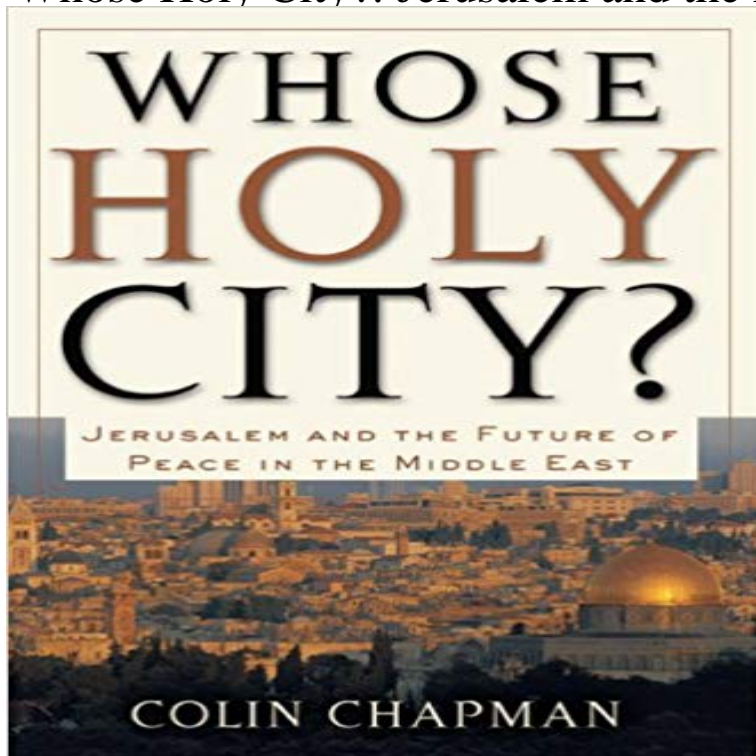


Whose Holy City?: Jerusalem and the Future of Peace in the Middle East
